Apex 40 Australia Inc. is not a Service Club, but an organisation formed to foster fellowship among past Apexians and their partners, and to retain the many friendships formed during their Apex years.

It also exists to assist Apex, when asked, and not to operate in opposition to Apex. It is open to past members and their partners, and Ex-World Councillors who have retired from their respective organisations.

Some Apex 40 members decided to form sub-committees which are generally based around past or present Apex Club locations. These sub-committees may meet monthly or less regularly, but all with a view to maintaining and fostering friendships, and occasionally providing assistance to Apex Clubs.

Each year members from Apex 40 gather for a weekend to attend the Annual Convention known as 'The Rort'. During this weekend there is a brief interruption to the festivities to conduct the necessary formality of The Annual General Meeting. In the past, after the RORT, a Post-RORT tour of 4 or 5 days duration has been programmed, visiting areas surrounding the town hosting The Rort. In future both events may be combined and shortened to reduce costs.

The socialising of individual members with each other, across the whole organisation, never ceases. When on an interstate holiday, for example, members invariably look up acquaintances and friends made during the Rorts. It is a huge social club and fosters friendships among whole families.

Membership is open to all past members of Apex, their partners and members of affiliated clubs.

Vale Ron Clarke of Bendigo Apex 40 from Melbourne Gippsland Apex 40



Ron Clarke (not the Olympian in 1956) passed away mid-July aged 85.

Ron was a past President and Life Member of Bendigo Apex and a long serving member of Bendigo Apex 40 Club.

Bendigo was the 8th Apex 40 Club formed and held a long association with Melbourne/Gippsland Apex 40 Club with many get togethers of the two clubs, with Ron via Niblick golf shoes a sponsor of our Annual Golf gets together formed through Alan Kinder our past member of Melbourne/Gippsland and National Board.

In the mid 1990's Ron was on National Board of Apex 40, and I took over from him as National President in 1995.

Ron was a Shoe Agent and acted for various manufacturers in selling their shoes as a wholesaler to the retail market.

One of these companies was Niblick/Cherub who developed the Niblick Golf shoe which in the late 1970's dominated the golf shoe industry and had over 90% of the Australian golf industry market. In those days Niblick was a sponsor to the young professional golfer Greg Norman and introduced by Ron. Hence this is how Ron became so popular at our annual tournaments played in Bendigo and Melbourne.

Our deepest sympathy has been passed onto Ron's family and members of Bendigo Apex 40.

Vale Kevin Frazer

Our 1st National Secretary of Apex 40, Kevin Frazer passed away late last July and was 6 days short of his 91st birthday.

While not a current member of our Club (due to age and living in Bittern, near Hastings) thought it appropriate to let you both know.

Kevin was National Secretary to Lionel Mussell and back in July 1975 on behalf of the Association, Apex 40 offered the founders of Apex, Ewen Laird and Langham Proud Honorary Life membership of our organisation.

While they refused life membership, they did mention that Apex was originally for young men aged 18 to 35 years old and believed that "Older "arrived" men could tend to put a break on the enthusiasm of youth, who lacking in inhibitions can "move mountains" if they so desire.

Kevin was a Foundation Member of the Apex Club of Nunawading in 1965 and retired when he turned 40, as was the practice in those days. Also, he was granted Life Membership of Apex.

He was one of the founding members of Apex 40 in 1973 with the formation of our club, Melbourne-Gippsland Apex 40 which was the first Apex 40 Club established. After Apex, Kevin joined Nunawading Lions Club in late 1979 and was member for nearly 45 years.




The latest lunch was held at the Eastern Suburbs Leagues Club on 23rd August.
